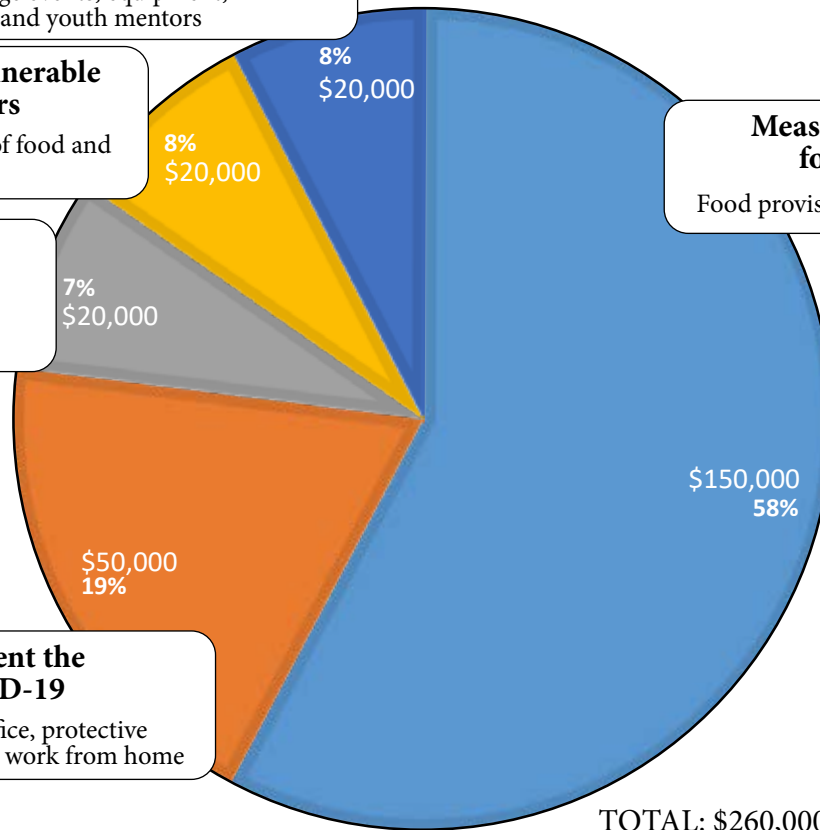

**Staff are working to build and to deliver food hampers to each household. This will happen in stages, and the amount of food per household depends on the number of occupants on the home tenancy agreement.*

ISC FORMULA

Indigenous Services Canada (ISC) formerly INAC

The funding formula for First Nations as explained on the ISC website:

‘On-reserve and self-governing First Nations communities will receive funding directly from ISC. The amount provided to each community takes into account a base amount of \$50,000 per community, the total number of people living in the community (based on the 2016 Census), and is then subject to possible adjustments based on remoteness (we are not considered remote) and Community Wellbeing index scores.’

This formula does not include off-reserve funding. Seabird Island Band has applied for off-reserve supports as well.

What the funding is intended for:

This is ISC Criteria for the COVID-19 Funding (taken from the ISC website) which includes but is not limited to:

1. “Support for elders and vulnerable community members”
2. “Measures to address food security”
3. “Educational supports and other support for children / youth”
4. “Emergency preparedness response”
