# Ministry of Children and Family Development (MCFD) Information Sharing Agreement:

The Information Sharing Agreement is for children in care, so Nations have a voice in planning for their children anywhere in the province.

Children who are in care; both short term or special needs agreements are included in the information sharing agreement. Here is an example: if a child was removed in the north that was connected to your community you would be called and your voice heard in planning for the child. For the Information Sharing Agreement the Director of Operation (Martin in your case) would meet with you quarterly to go over the list of all the children in care from your Nation in the province.

With the quality assurance committee meetings, the trust/relationship in the way MCFD and your community walk together at a local level.

# Pipeline pump station job opportunities - pursue pre-screening now!

Pipeline pump station construction is being done by WorleyParsonsCord, on contract with Trans Mountain Pipeline. They will be looking for a number of trades disciplines, both apprentice and journeyperson positions, including the following:

They are hiring a full crew for each of 4 pump stations, with staff leapfrogging their way down the line. The South BC crew will be starting at the Black Pines Pump Station (north of Kamloops) in March of 2020. Hope Station is due to start until April of 2021. Each pump station typically takes 8 months to complete. There are 4 pump stations in the Southern BC spread – allowing for probably 2 years of work for an apprentice to put in their book.



3<sup>rd</sup> student allowance payment will be June 30

March, April, May, June.

**Student Allowances are as follows:** Grade 7-10 \$9.<sup>00</sup> per month = \$90.<sup>00</sup> per school year. Grade 11-12 \$19.<sup>00</sup> per month = \$190.<sup>00</sup> per school year.

Student allowances will be directly deposited for the students with bank accounts.

Student allowances are based on monthly attendance. Student must not miss more than 4 school days per month to be eligible for allowance.

# JOB POSTINGS

### Recreation Coordinator

The Recreation Coordinator is responsible for creating and leading fitness and recreation activities for the community. The Recreation Coordinator will consult with staff and Community Members to determine their needs and interests and establish activities in response to those needs. The Recreation Coordinator will report to the Director of Community Development. This is a part-time position of 15 hours per week.

### Speech & Language Pathologist

Provides a range of clinical services that focus on promoting communication, language & speech that contribute to a client/patient's overall cognitive, physical, social and emotional well-being. The Speech & Language Pathologist works closely with babies and children who have various levels of speech, language and communication problems. The successful candidate will provide assessments to children (0-6 years old) referred to the Ey Qwal Speech and Language Program.

### Professional Cook Instructor

Seabird College is seeking a qualified teacher/ instructor to provide Professional Cook 1 instruction to Adult Learners completing their Professional Cook 1 Industry Training Authority Program. The position will start in January. The successful candidate will be offered a one-year term, subject to sufficient student enrollment.

### Life Skills Coach

Under the direction of the Health and Social Development Director, the Family Life Skills Coach (FLSC) will operate efficiently in accordance with the philosophies, policies and objectives established by Seabird Island Band Management and within the specifications and regulations of the Community Care Facility Act.

The primary goal of the FLSC is to ensure that the families in the family home are supported in developing healthy parenting and other life skills, with attention to children's needs (helping with homework, structured mealtimes, healthy meals, bedtime routines etc.). The FLSC will ensure strong cultural values and manage programming that builds family bonds and resilience as well as a grounding in culture and community supports. Approaches to household chores, shopping and finances will also be modeled. The FLSC will ensure that families are directed to health, healing and other services and programs and encourage them to make choices that are nurturing to self and family. The Life skills Coach ensures that culture is embedded in all services

### **Health Policy and Quality Officer**

Under the direction and supervision of the Health Director, the Health Policy and Quality Officer is responsible for Developing Health policies and procedures which are required for effective programming and meet the applicable standards. This officer also ensure that the Health Department has a quality assurance program that enables us to continue to achieve excellence Health service.Duties include identifying policy creation needs, developing policies with a culturally relevant perspective, assisting with strategic planning and professional practice developing program evaluation documents. This positon is also responsible for the development of the Community Health Plan.

### IT Teacher - Full Time

This position involves the provision of instruction to students of Seabird Island Community School/High School. Includes instruction, preparation, assessment, classroom management, professional development and school meetings. Community and parental relations and adherence to all Seabird Island Community School and BC Ministry of Education policies and procedures.

Information Technology or IT Teachers must prepare lessons and activities that help students develop knowledge and understanding in concepts of computing, software use, troubleshooting, etc. The IT Teacher's daily tasks will depend mostly on the age and ability level of the students. Younger classrooms will focus on keyboarding and understanding basic word processing and other typical office programs, as well as Internet basics. With older students. more advanced classes in software use, data processing, hardware and even web design.

The IT Teacher is often expected to solve minor technical problems that happen within their classrooms, so computer troubleshooting experience is important.

### **Dental Hygienist On-Call**

Perform basic dental care tasks, mostly focused on keeping patients' teeth and gums clean and giving instruction in proper dental hygiene. The Dental Hygienist will work under the supervision of licensed Dentist. They are not qualified to make the same kind of diagnostic decisions or perform the same procedures as Dentists. Unlike Dental Assistants, who work directly with Dentists, Hygienists often see patients on their own and direct their own tasks.

The goal of a Dental Hygienist is to provide the following services as a way to support and promote optimum oral health:

### Certified Dental Assistant - Part Time/ On Call

The Certified Dental Assistant will greet and prepare patients for dental exams and procedures. The Certified Dental Assistant will be trained to use a variety of dental equipment and they will assist the Dentist during dental and oral procedures and instruct patients on post-operative and general oral health care. The Certified Dental Assistant will also be responsible for maintaining dental equipment. sterilizing instruments and ensuring necessary items are stocked.

### **Educations Assistant - On call**

Under the supervision of school administration, the Education Assistant (EA) will work with students individually or in small groups to deliver activities that reinforce and advance the educational program and make the educational experiences of the children more rewarding. EA's will assist teachers in student assessment and evaluation through observation, record keeping and data collection. At Seabird Island Community School, Education Assistants are valued members of the school community and they make a significant contribution to the work of the school and toward the education of all students.

### Custodian - On Call & Part Time

The Custodian is responsible for performing custodial duties, minor maintenance and other miscellaneous duties in order to ensure that buildings and facilities are maintained in a healthy, safe and sanitary manner.

### Early Childhood Education Cultural Worker

The Early Childhood Cultural Worker provides cultural programming, activities in all our Early Childhood Programs. To engage and teach our children, families and staff our language and cultural through age appropriate activities

### Education Director (ED)

Under the direction and supervision of the Executive Director (ED), the Director of Education, shall provide leadership and management expertise, in accordance with Band policies. Specifically, the Director shall be responsible to the Executive Director for the efficient, effective and productive operation of the Seabird Island College, Elementary and High Schools, including oversight of the nominal role and education programs.

The Director is responsible for researching, requesting and securing funding for all educational programming, which will be of key importance to the Education Department and will be a high priority. The Director will also be responsible for the professional management of all staff and financial resources available to the Department. This will require working closely with Departmental leadership (Principal, Vice Principals and the Human Resources Department).

The Education Director participates collaboratively and fully as a member of the Directors Team with respect to departmental and interdepartmental matters to ensure that the advancement of the Band's goals and aspirations are achieved and maintained.

### **Executive Assistant**

The Executive Assistant will perform direct administrative and professional support to the assigned director. The Executive Assistant is expected to provide support directly to assigned director, as well as to the individual employees or members.

The Executive Assistant will be privy to all business relations and information. It is expected that the ability to maintain the highest level of confidence is a priority. The nature of this position requires the Executive Assistant to have knowledge and the ability to access resources. It is also expected The Executive Assistant must be able to retain this information without allowing it to impact their treatment of those groups or individuals such as information pertaining to many Band/Community Members, staff members, and other stake holders.

### **Dental Office Supervisor**

The Dental Office Supervisor will be responsible for efficiently and effectively managing day-to-day operations in the dental office. This would include organizing, planning and overseeing dental office staff; ensuring that the dentists scheduled appointments are verified and chairs are kept in full operation at all times. Ensuring that services of the Highest Quality are provided to community members and external clients at all times.

## Preschool/OOSC/Summer Program Supervisor

The Supervisor of Preschool, Out Of School Care and Summer Programs will assume responsibility for the day to day operations of the all three of these programs. The Supervisor is responsible for program planning in cooperation with other program staff, working effectively with staff, families and children, connecting with the community and ensuring adherence with licensing requirements. The Supervisor is responsible for providing leadership in keeping with the philosophy of the Early Learning and Child Care Program at Seabird Island.

This position will have many responsibilities, including, being the lead teacher for the 3's preschool, supervising the 4's preschool, Out Of School Care (during school months) and Summer Program for the summer.

The Early Childhood Department plans and implements many activities that help create awareness, understanding and respect of our culture. Speaking in the Halq'eméylem language is one of many cultural activities that happens at the Early Childhood Center of Excellence. A willingness to learn Halq'eméylem is essential.

### **Special Education Teacher**

Under the supervision of school administration, the Special Education Teacher will work with Students who have a wide range of learning, mental, emotional, physical and learning disabilities. Special Ed. Assistant's adapt general education lessons and teach various subjects, such as reading, writing, and math, to students with mild and moderate disabilities. They also teach basic skills, such as literacy and communication techniques, to students with severe disabilities.

Some Special Ed. Teachers will work with students who have physical and sensory disabilities, such as blindness and deafness and with students who are wheelchair-bound. They may also work with those who have autism spectrum disorders and emotional disorders, such as anxiety and depression.

Special Ed. Teachers help students with severe disabilities develop basic life skills, such as how to respond to questions and how to follow directions.

### Intermediate Teacher

This position involves the provision of instruction to students of Seabird Island Community School and includes instruction, preparation, assessment, classroom management, professional development and school meetings, community and parental relations and adherence to all Seabird Island Community School and BC Ministry of Education policies and procedures. Individual contracts will govern the specific teaching assignment and number of hours. The Salary is inclusive of all teaching duties as detailed below.

### Membership Clerk

Reporting to the Director of Lands and Government Affairs, the Membership Clerk is responsible for maintaining the integrity of information contained with the Indian Registrar, while providing membership duties for the purpose of issuing Certificates of Indian Status (CIS) Cards to SIB and Community Members.


