### For the Secure Certificate of Indian Status (SCIS) Card

Office Hours: Monday-Friday, 9:00AM to 5:00PM **by appointment only.**

#### What you will need to bring to your appointment:

1. **Identity Documents** – at least one (1) piece of valid government issued photo ID which contains your name, DOB, photo and signature.
2. **Photos** – you must provide two (2) identical and unaltered Canadian passport-style photos, taken within the last twelve (12) months of the date of your application.
3. **Name-Linking Documents** – if you have recently been married or have legally changed your name you will need to provide an **original** Certificate of Marriage Document or Legal Change of Name Document.

The SCIS once received in the mail will be valid for ten (10) years for adults and five (5) years for children.

Please contact Nathon Jimmie at the Band Office at 604-796-2177 to book your appointment and to discuss ID requirements and photo options.

**IMPORTANT NOTE:** SIN cards, photocopied ID, bank cards, credit cards, and damaged or mutilated ID are **NOT** acceptable forms of ID and will be rejected.

# How We Can Prevent Recycling Contamination

Contamination is a major obstacle in the recycling process. It occurs when material that is not accepted for recycling is put in recycling bins. There are many examples of contamination and they include:

- Material not accepted by Recycle BC
  - › Material that is not packaging or paper
  - › Material that can't be recycled with current recycling technology
  - › Hazardous material, including batteries, propane or butane cylinders, needles, lighters
- Containers with contents (e.g. food or liquid) inside
- Material sorted incorrectly
- Material tied in a plastic bag

## Why Preventing Contamination is Important

When it comes to recycling, we're all in this together. From everyone here at Recycle BC, to the dedicated collection and post-collection crews, to you – the residents of BC – we all work together to ensure the success of the recycling system. In our 2019 Annual Report, we were happy to report that 90% of collected tonnes in the Recycle BC program were managed by recycling. Low contamination is a contributing factor to a high recycling rate.

## Collector Spotlight: City of Terrace

The City of Terrace is a great example of everyone – residents and collectors – pitching in to successfully reduce



contamination. In 2018, curbside recycling contamination was nearly 14% in Terrace but after education campaigns, deeper visual screening by drivers during pick-up, and stricter enforcement of bylaw, Terrace reduced their curbside contamination level to 5%.

## Easy Ways to Prevent Contamination

1. Rinse your containers as soon as they're empty. Put a little warm water and soap inside and then put the lid back on to shake it up and loosen anything that's stuck. Watch our rinsing video so you can see how clean is clean.
2. Sort your material. If you don't have room for your recycling bins/bags inside, keep re-usable shopping bags or smaller bins to sort your material according to how your recycling is collected from your home (paper, containers and possibly glass) and depot-only materials – so it's an easy transfer to the curb on collection day.
3. Check the Recycle BC material list to see what is accepted and how to sort it. You can download our app or find our material list at [RecycleBC.ca/Materials](https://RecycleBC.ca/Materials).
4. Follow your local recycling guidelines. In some areas of BC, Recycle BC manages recycling collection and the guidelines can be found in the recycling guides available on our website. In areas where the local government manages recycling, it's best to check their website and follow their social media for any messaging specific to where you live. For example, this recent Facebook post by the City of Nanaimo addresses cardboard contamination in their blue carts given a recent increase in cardboard due to more home deliveries during the pandemic.

# Seabird Island Income Assistance Update

To date, IA clients have been receiving an additional \$300/month per eligibility. This is the **COVID Supplement**. This supplement has been extended until January 2021. If you have received CERB, you are not entitled to the additional \$300.

There is an additional **COVID Benefit** that is going to be made available. If you were **head of household** in April, May and June of 2020 you may be entitled to an additional retroactive amount of \$300/per month (Total of \$900).

The priority of the Benefit is to ensure BC Hydro, Fortis and rent is all up to date. Please submit all your utility bills and rental updates to Erna by **November 16, 2020** to verify your eligibility of these funds. If your utilities and rent are all up to date, we can then either make an addition to your December cheque or have some gift cards (for groceries) put aside for your family's use.

A Budgeting 101 Class will be **Mandatory** for clients to take prior to funds being released. You will learn how to open a bank account, register your utility bills to your account, managing your monthly income. If you need assistance obtaining ID, please ensure you let us know immediately .

## Youth Worker

The Youth Worker is directly responsible for engaging Seabird Island Band youths (age 10 – 19) in youth-led programming. The core of this work will be done through the drop-in program but may also include secondary programs such as gender specific groups, recreational activities groups and outreach programs. The philosophy of this work is to build the skills and capacities of the youth to be leaders in their programs, caring out the daily program activities, engaging with other youth in a meaningful way and caring for the physical space of the youth centre.

This position requires a flexible schedule to meet the needs of the Band youth. Given the schedule of the client base (school), most shifts will be evenings and weekends. Position end date March 31, 2021.

## Special Education Teacher

Under the supervision of school administration, the Special Education Teacher will work with Students who have a wide range of learning, mental, emotional, physical and learning disabilities. Special Ed. Assistant's adapt general education lessons and teach various subjects, such as reading, writing and math, to students with mild and moderate disabilities. They also teach basic skills, such as literacy and communication techniques, to students with severe disabilities.

## Speech & Language Pathologist

The Speech & Language Pathologist provides a range of clinical services that focus on promoting communication, language and speech and that contribute to a client/patient's overall cognitive, physical, social and emotional well-being. The speech and language pathologist works closely with babies, children who have various levels of speech, language and communication problems. The successful candidate will provide assessments to children (0-6 years old) referred to the Ey Qwal Speech and Language Program.

## Maternal Child Health Nurse

Under the direction of the Health Services Program Manager, the Maternal Child Health RN shall provide Maternity care, newborn care and expertise in accordance with Band policies and procedures. This position is responsible for the delivery of services to families living off reserve and families where substance use is occurring. This role works closely other members of the Maternal Child Health team and with pre and post-natal moms, youth and families in the program. The Maternal Child Health RN works closely with the Mid-Wife and will be required to take training as labour/delivery back-up to the Mid-Wife.

## Cook - On Call

To prepare, cook and serve food for school breakfast/lunch programs and special events organized and participated by Seabird School as instructed by the Principal / Vice Principal in accordance with current health, safety and hygiene legislation.

## Math/English Adult Dogwood Instructor

The Adult Dogwood Instructor teaches a variety of Adult Education courses. This position specifically focuses on English and Math, and other related courses that contribute to an Adult Dogwood Diploma and vocational students who seek to obtain a trade or occupational certificate in their work plan.

## Teacher On Call ( TOC)

This position involves the provision of instruction to students of Seabird Island Community School and includes instruction, preparation, assessment, classroom management, professional development and school meetings, community and parental relations and adherence to all Seabird Island Community School and BC Ministry of Education policies and procedures. Individual contracts will govern the specific teaching assignment and number of hours. The Salary is inclusive of all teaching duties as detailed below.

## Assistant Health Director/ Executive Assistant to Health Director

Under the supervision and direction of the Health Director, the Assistant Health Director/ Executive Assistant (AHD/EA) provides functional and administrative support of the Health Department. This position is a mentored position for the purposes of creating competencies in the employee related to the Health Director role. This person assumes the role of the Health Director in the Director's absence.

## Pre-Employment Supports Program - Administrative Assistant - Maternity Term until March 31, 2021

The Seabird Employment Center is providing an opportunity for a pre-employment Supports Program (PESP) Administrative Assistant. Responsibilities will include answering phones, booking appointments for clients, file management, organizing, driving school administration and other clerical duties. This position will also require the successful applicant to be able to provide exceptional client and customer service; courteous, friendly, and professional assistance to clients from a broad demographic. The Work term is till March 2021.

## Marketing & Communications Supervisor

The Marketing & Communications Supervisor oversees and supervises all marketing, promotion, communications activities of Seabird Island Band and its related business entities. This also involves the developing and implementation of internal and external marketing strategies and the direct supervision of the marketing and communications department and related business entities.

Core duties include the supervision of operations, staff, production, sales, and reporting concerning the Marketing and Communications Department of SIB and its related business entities.

The Order Clerk receives and processes orders for materials and merchandise. Tracks orders, updates status and notifies customers of changes in delivery schedule. Being an Order Clerk maintains records of prices, delivery dates, inventory and other data related to each transaction. Additionally, the Order Clerk requires a high school diploma or its equivalent and will report to the SIB Purchasing Manager. The Order Clerk possesses a moderate understanding of general aspects of the job. Works under the close direction of senior personnel in the functional area. May require 1 to 3 years of general work experience.

## Education Assistant - On call

Under the supervision of school administration, the Education Assistant (EA) will work with students individually or in small groups to deliver activities that reinforce and advance the educational program and make the educational experiences of the children more rewarding.

## IT Teacher - Full Time

This position involves the provision of instruction to students of Seabird Island Community School/High School and includes instruction, preparation, assessment, classroom management, professional development and school meetings, community and parental relations and adherence to all Seabird Island Community School and BC Ministry of Education policies and procedures.

Information Technology or IT Teachers must prepare lessons and activities that help students develop knowledge and understanding in concepts of computing, software use, troubleshooting, etc. The IT Teacher's daily tasks will depend mostly on the age and ability level of the students. Younger classrooms will focus on keyboarding and understanding basic word processing and other typical office programs, as well as internet basics. With older students, more advanced classes in software use, data processing, hardware, and even web design.

The IT Teacher is often expected to solve minor technical problems that happen within their classrooms, so computer troubleshooting experience is important.

## 22 week Targeted Wage Subsidy - Information Technician

This is a "Term" position until March 31, 2021 with responsibility for equipment operation and processing of information assets for the organization's electronic imaging of maps, drawings and as-built's. General office equipment used includes photocopiers, scanners and computers.

## Accounts Payable Assistant

The Accounts Payable Assistant provides technical services using clerical skills to assure the accurate and timely payment of expenses for Seabird Island Band programs. The position must maintain confidentiality of all financial records.

## Mail Clerk

The Mail Clerks primary function is to facilitate the timely delivery of paper communications to and from both internal and external sources. This will include opening, stamping, sorting, scanning, emailing and delivery of inter office mail to all employees, buildings, and offices operated by the Band.

## Legacy Project Coordinator

This is a two-year term position. The Legacy Project Coordinator (LPC) will lead activities to gain information on and manage the traditional land holdings on Seabird Island Band reserve. The LPC will merge non-registered historical knowledge of Seabird Island Band land use and occupancy with the First Nations Lands Registry System or upgraded system of lands management. Research activities will include land tenures, individual land holdings, right of occupancy, and certificates of allocation or possession.

## Better At Home Support Worker

The Better at Home Program is designed to provide support to community members who need additional assistance to continue to reside at home in the community. The Labourer plays a key role in the Better at Home Program, providing the leg work to support the clients. Labourer can expect to perform a very wide variety of tasks to support a wide variety of clients. Assigned responsibilities will include indoor and outdoor activities, including working in high and low temperatures, and inclement weather (rain, snow etc.). Successful Better at Home Labourer should prepare to work long physically demanding hours, will be required to provide their own clothing appropriate to the day's tasks and weather, and may be asked to provide their own personal safety equipment.

## Health Quality Officer - Maternity Term until May 31, 2021

Under the direction and supervision of the Health Director, the Health Quality Officer is responsible for Developing Health and maintaining Health programs infrastructure including: professional practice support, Health Policies and procedures, and service standards which are required for effective programming. This officer will also ensure that the Health department has a quality assurance program that enables us to continue to achieve excellence in Health services.

## Maternal Child Health Nurse

Under the direction of the Health Services Program Manager, the Maternal Child Health RN shall provide Maternity care, newborn care and expertise in accordance with Band policies and procedures. This position is responsible for the delivery of services to families living off reserve and families where substance use is occurring. This role works closely other members of the Maternal Child Health team and with pre and post-natal moms, youth and families in the program. The Maternal Child Health RN works closely with the Mid-Wife and will be required to take training as labour/delivery back-up to the Mid-Wife.

## Peer House Leader - Women Home

Under the direction of the Health and Social Development Director, the A:yelxw Peer House Leader (APHL) will operate efficiently in accordance with the philosophies, policies, and objectives established by Seabird Island Band and within the specifications and regulations of the Community Care Facility Act.

## Recovery Home Support Worker

The role of the Recovery Support Worker is to support clients in residence struggling with substance use issues possible to facilitate personal growth and relationship building, as well as other duties associated with the recovery home such as cooking, cleaning, charting, participating in group sessions, driving and shopping.

## Computer Technician II

Reporting to the IT Program Manager, this position works with all Seabird Island (SI) Departments. The Computer Technician II involves maintenance of systems and technical equipment. The Computer Technician II will analyze requirements, resolve problems, and install hardware and software as required. Tasks also include end-user support, toner inventory maintenance and procurement, and various tasks received through the IT Help Desk. Please note this is a one year full time term contract.
