

Starting January 18, the District of Kent Community Recreation and Cultural Center is offering a FREE program called MEND - Mind, Exercise, Nutrition, Do it!

MEND is a fun, FREE 10-week program for families with 7-13 year olds. The program supports families to live a healthy lifestyle. Groups of up to 15-children, accompanied by at least one parent or caregiver meet with program leaders twice a week for 10-weeks. The first hour is an interactive family session on nutrition and behaviour topics. Followed by one hour of fun exercise for the children, while parents and caregivers meet for support and discussion on topics such as goals and rewards, label reading and problem solving.

The program will take place Mondays and Wednesdays from 5:30 - 7:30 p.m.



Walmart Canada Community Grant awarded to Traditional Food Bank



Seabird Island's Traditional Food Bank was recently selected to received a \$1,000 Walmart Canada Community Grant.

The grant will be used to supply the Traditional Food Bank with healthy, homemade canned foods.

The Traditional Food Bank has been in operation for years, but in 2014 Seabird Island shifted away from offering "belly fillers" like Kraft Dinner and canned pork and beans and replaced them with healthier traditional foods such as fruit and vegetables, fish caught by local fishermen and wild game hunted by Band Members.

The B.C. public post-secondary sector and government are working together to develop an online system that will consolidate existing government-supported advisory and application resources for students, making it easier to plan, search, and apply for post-secondary education in B.C.



Why are we doing this?

EducationPlannerBC will integrate planning and application services in one website. By using the centralized EducationPlannerBC planning resources, students can search for information about various programs, institutions and communities across BC, allowing them to make informed decisions about the programs to which they choose to apply. When students decide to apply to one or more programs, they can then easily complete the application without having to re-enter the same information each time.

What has already happened?

- Developed and implemented an interim governance structure and strategic framework
- Established Policy, Governance and Technology Working Groups (made up of representatives from across the 25 public post-secondary institutions)
- Launched policy consultations to gather input from across the public post-secondary sector to inform planning and decision making
- Implemented initial system changes— EducationPlanner and ApplyBC were integrated in to the new <u>EducationPlannerBC.ca</u> website. Check it out!!!



What is happening next?

In early 2017, further changes will be introduced to EducationPlannerBC.ca. They include:

- 1. Expanding existing application services: ensuring application questions can capture text answers to program specific questions, providing more specific program information and adding the ability upload documents with
- 2. <u>Increasing community visibility</u>: improving the ability for students to search by community and creating more visible links to existing community information sites.
- Making additional improvements: continuing to enhance the overall user experience of the site.

What else is happening?

- A Business Case will be developed to guide further activities.
- A new long term governance structure will be developed to operate the system.



Recipe Corner with Val Thomson: Cancun Tortilla Soup



Makes 8 to 10 Servings

Sauté together in a large soup pot:

- ¼ cup butter
- 3 cups diced onion
- 1 teaspoon cumin
- 1 tsp garlic powder (or 1 clove minced garlic)
- 2 tablespoons paste-style chicken base or 1 tablespoon granulated soup base

Add the next 3 ingredients and heat until thickened and beans are soft. (The original recipe calls for 2 cups of crushed thick corn tortilla chips to be added along with the water and the tomatoes. But Val omitted this and added her crushed chips right into the bowl when serving.)

- 4 cups diced tomatoes
- 10 cups water
- 5 cups dried refried beans

Garnish:

- ½ cup diced green onions
- ½ cup chopped cilantro
- 1 diced red bell pepper
- Tortilla chips
- Sour cream

Grade 7 - 12 Student Allowances

1st student allowance payment Dec. 15, 2016 (for September, October and November)

2nd student allowance payment Mar. 15, 2017 (for December, January and February)

3rd student allowance payment Jun. 30, 2017 (for March, April, May and June)

Student Allowances are as follows:

Grade 7-10 \$9.00/month = \$90.00/school year

Grade 11 -12 \$19.00/month = \$190.00/school year

Student allowances will be paid by direct deposit for students with bank accounts.

Student allowances are based on monthly attendance.

Student must not miss more than 4 school days per month to be eligible for allowance.
