

# Adaptive Heat Mapping

- Continued progress on the Adaptive Heat Mapping project spanning **Bear Mountain to Ruby Creek** (44.62 km²).
- About 40 sensors have been installed so far to obtain real-time temperature data
- The project will help identify vulnerable zones and support the development of proactive climate adaptation measures.




Installation of sensor

# Fish & Wildlife Upper Maria Slough Restoration

- Effectiveness monitoring of site shows good growth of native plants and improved water quality; beaver dam spotted near downstream end and wildlife monitoring camera installed.
- Seabird and KWL returning in August to remove plugged culvert by hand.
- Seabird will complete Community
  Composition trapping in this new site
  during the month of August see what
  species have responded so far to the site.

# Fish & Wildlife Other Projects

- Hicks Creek Scoping Study: work that was planned for winter 2025 is now planned for 2026 with new funding support (application submitted for the Salmon Resiliency Fund and is under review).
- Discussion with multiple project teams to discuss a master plan for Fraser River Reconnect.
- Z-Slough Offset connecting Lizzie Lake to upstream Maria Slough. Project set to start during winter 2025.



# Fish & Wildlife Water Quality Monitoring


- The Fish & Wildlife team has completed water quality monitoring in the slough since 2023, taking over from Resilient Waters.

  Dissolved oxygen, water temperature, and water depth are being monitored at key locations in Maria Slough.
- Three new conductivity loggers were deployed in the upper slough this spring. Results will be shared at the next Ripple Report.
- There are 5 dissolved oxygen and 8 depth loggers in Maria Slough. Please leave these in place to collect information for F&W!



### Elders Program

- Four elders collaborated with our staff to produce jam for the enjoyment of all the elders residing on Seabird. In total, we made 419 jars of jam, including regular raspberry jam and a low-sugar raspberry jam.
- Had a meeting with Lolly, Becky, and Jordan regarding the elders' need for home renovations. Created a new elders list divided into those under and over 65, plus added three new elders to the list. (113 on reserve, 10 are non-status).









The Second-Generation Cut-Off prevents many First Nations people from passing their status down to their children and grandchildren.


After two consecutive generations of parents who do not have Indian status, the third generation is no longer entitled to registration.

It's Important that we understand the effects of the Second-Generation Cut-off and inform our future generations of the impacts it has on First Nations people.

### Second-Generation Cut-Off

We are starting to see the effects of the "Second-Generation Cut-Off" as more of our children are being <u>denied</u> status.

# Referrals

# What is a Referral?

- The Referrals Process is initiated when a proponent is requesting knowledge, expertise and consultation from Sq'ewqel First Nation.
- Referrals are a formal acknowledgement of Sq'ewqel's, interests, and perspectives, and serves as a steppingstone for meaningful engagement concerning projects taking place on S'olh Temexw's unceded territory and beyond. Our focus starts with territory surrounding Sq'ewqel, and expands to Tiyt Tribes, branches out to Sto:lo Tribal territories and then all of S'olh Temexw.

### Referrals and S'olh Temexw Stewardship Alliance

Seabird Island referrals have been signatories of the S'olh Temexw Stewardship Alliance. This agreement between the Signatory Stó:lō First Nations and the Province of British Columbia has been drafted to increase consultation effectiveness and efficiency, lead to greater certainty for land and resource decisions. Promote dialogue between the parties, and ensure the Province works towards fulfilling the duty to consult, where appropriate for the Rights and Title interests of Stó:lō People on proposed activities within S'ólh Téméxw.

As such we work closely with PRRO People of the Referrals Officers collaboratively determining impacts and expectations of proponents while carrying out their works on the land.

# Draft Referral Framework, what's been completed so far?

- We have developed the levels 3-5 checklist for,
  - Economics
  - Environmental (Biologist)
  - Natural Resources
  - Policy
- 2. Updated the Framework with the latest version of the 2024 STSA SEA Agreement and printed for hardcopy to have on hand.
- 3. Framework being implemented already when determining referral priority and processing steps.

#### Newest Member to Referrals-Mitchell April

Mitchell has joined our team in April as our Referrals Coordinator.

Mitchell will be taking on the coordinator roles and will be working closely with our technical team and alongside the People of the River Referrals Office.

### Internal Engagements

# UNDRIP and DRIPA alignment

- With MNP as consultants, Sq'éwqel is evaluating the alignment of their policies with UNDRIP and DRIPA.
- MNP has:
  - ▶ Developed a Policy Implementation Plan, and the Policy Division has commenced the implementation of the recommendations from MNP.

## Pathways to Self-Governance

- With Strategies North Advisory Inc. as consultants, Sq'ewqel will be engaging in a pathways analysis to understand its options for an actionable path towards self-governance.
- An engagement session with the Band's leadership, management, and key knowledge holders will be held on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of July.

# Internal Engagements and policy Reviews



#### **Local Emergency Agreement**

With Mandell Pinder as consultants, Sq'éwqel has developed a Local Emergency Agreement template. The agreement is part of our emergency preparedness process.



#### **US Tribes Policy Development**

The government is developing a new policy that requires consulting with Indigenous Tribes from the US on Aboriginal rights and title matters.

# External Policy Reviews and Engagements



The provincial government is proposing a regulation to allow early construction activities for the FRTP to begin before a full Environmental Assessment Certificate (EAC) is issued. The purpose of this plan is to avoid delays in the FRTP. Without this regulation, the project would have to wait until the EAC is issued which can potentially cause up to a full year's delay.

We noted that Sq'éwqel can use the consultation period to demand stronger consent protections, Indigenous oversight, and advance notice for future projects affecting its lands and waters.



#### BC Municipalities criticism of Bills 14 & 15

Bill 14 speeds up permits for renewable energy projects, while Bill 15 gives the province expanded powers to fast-tract infrastructure, potentially bypassing local and Indigenous decision-making.

Both Bills infringe on rights to Free, Prior and Informed Consent (FPIC), and so, they are being protested by Sq'éwqel and many First Nations.

• We have commenced preparing the first draft of the amended Code based on results of the survey conducted in the community.

#### Occupational Health & Safety Policy

• We are collaborating with the HR Division t to review the OHS Policy. To comply with current government standards on health and safety.

#### Pet Policy

 We are collaborating with the Housing department to make amendments to the Pet Policy.

#### Thíytelh Wellness Program

 We are collaborating with the Health department to develop a community-driven and culturally grounded wellness program to support young adults who are navigating challenges related to substance use and mental health.



#### Fitness Centre

- Approximately 26 participants daily on average in the last four months
  - Elders' fitness has 7-9 participants in the last 20 sessions
  - Seabird island high school has an average of 16 students from May-June

- Also collaborating with the school to integrate wrestling




