



Fraser Salmon Bulletin No: 2026-1

Date: July 3, 2026

This is the first Fraser Salmon Bulletin for the 2026 season. These bulletins will be provided every two to four weeks, typically when planned management changes come into effect, until mid-October once the Fraser Salmon migration has largely concluded. The purpose of this bulletin is to provide links and information to keep yourself up to date on in-season fishing information.

Fraser Chinook

The Albion Chinook test fishery has operated since 1981 on the lower Fraser River at Albion, BC (near Fort Langley). The test fishery is conducted with a drifted gill net at a specific site near the old Albion ferry crossing. On each day of operation, the boat fishes two sets, timed to coincide with the daily high tide.

The Chinook test fishery uses two different nets which fish on alternating days: the "standard" Chinook net, which is constructed using eight-inch mesh; and a "multi-panel" net, which consists of panels of six-, seven-, eight-, and nine-inch mesh. Both gill nets are 200 fathoms long. The purpose of the multi-panel net is to ensure representative sampling of Chinook passing through the lower Fraser River, due to the wide range of body sizes observed in Fraser River Chinook stocks.

Albion test fishery data largely consist of a long-term series of catch data that provides important information on run timing and stock composition of Chinook salmon migrating up the Fraser River. This information is currently used in post-season analysis to parse out the catch in various fisheries by stock grouping (i.e., Management Unit). Albion catch per unit effort (CPUE) data are used in-season to estimate the total return of Fraser Spring and Summer 5₂ Chinook to the mouth of the Fraser River with a linear regression model of historical CPUEs and run sizes.

In 2026, the Albion test fishery commenced on May 1 and will collect Chinook data daily until August 31. After August 31, the test fishery alternates fishing the standard (8" mesh) Chinook gill net with a smaller mesh (6 ¾") gill net designed to assess the return of Chum Salmon to the Fraser River. The test fishery stops fishing with the standard Chinook gill net after October 20.

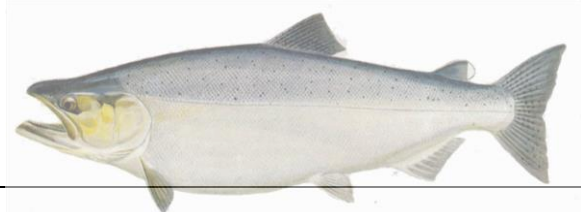
2026 Albion Chinook Catch – [Link to online Albion information.](#)

For 2026, Albion run size updates for the Spring and Summer 5₂ management units (MUs) are provided for information purposes only and will not be used in-season to adjust management measures given conservation concerns.

On June 19, fishery notice [FN0610](#) was sent out outlining the details of the final in-season run size estimate for these MUs. A brief summary of the notice is also provided below.

The standard version of the in-season abundance model, that is based only on the 8-inch mesh data, predicts a terminal return for the Fraser River Spring 5₂ and Summer 5₂ Chinook aggregate of 54,500 (95% PI of 28,000 to 107,000).

Additionally, the low catch at the test fishery suggests low abundance for the Spring 5₂ and Summer 5₂ Chinook Salmon returning in 2026, and indicates ongoing low productivity for these MUs.

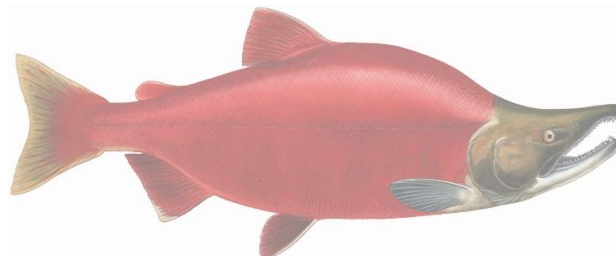

Below Port Mann Bridge	Consideration for Limited Participation licenses targeting Chinook for community ceremonial needs. No communal opportunities until further notice.
Port Mann to Sawmill Creek	Consideration for Limited Participation licenses targeting 6 Chinook per event for 2 events per year per community. Short duration communal opportunities provided in April and May. No communal opportunities until further notice.
Sawmill Creek to Texas, including Thompson d/s Bonaparte	Consideration for Limited Participation licenses targeting 6 Chinook per event and short-duration communal opportunities using selective gear.
Texas to Deadman	Consideration for Limited Participation licenses
Deadman to Naver (includes tribs)	No fisheries licensed at this time.
Upstream of Naver Confluence (includes tribs)	Communal chinook opportunity with a catch limit in place
Thompson u/s of Bonaparte and tribs	No fisheries licensed at this time.

Early-Timed Sockeye Window Closure

For 2026, the window closure in place to protect Early Stuart and earlier-timed Early Summer Sockeye will be approximately 4 weeks in duration. **Note the Early Stuart run timing has been updated which has affected some of the start and end dates in the below table.**

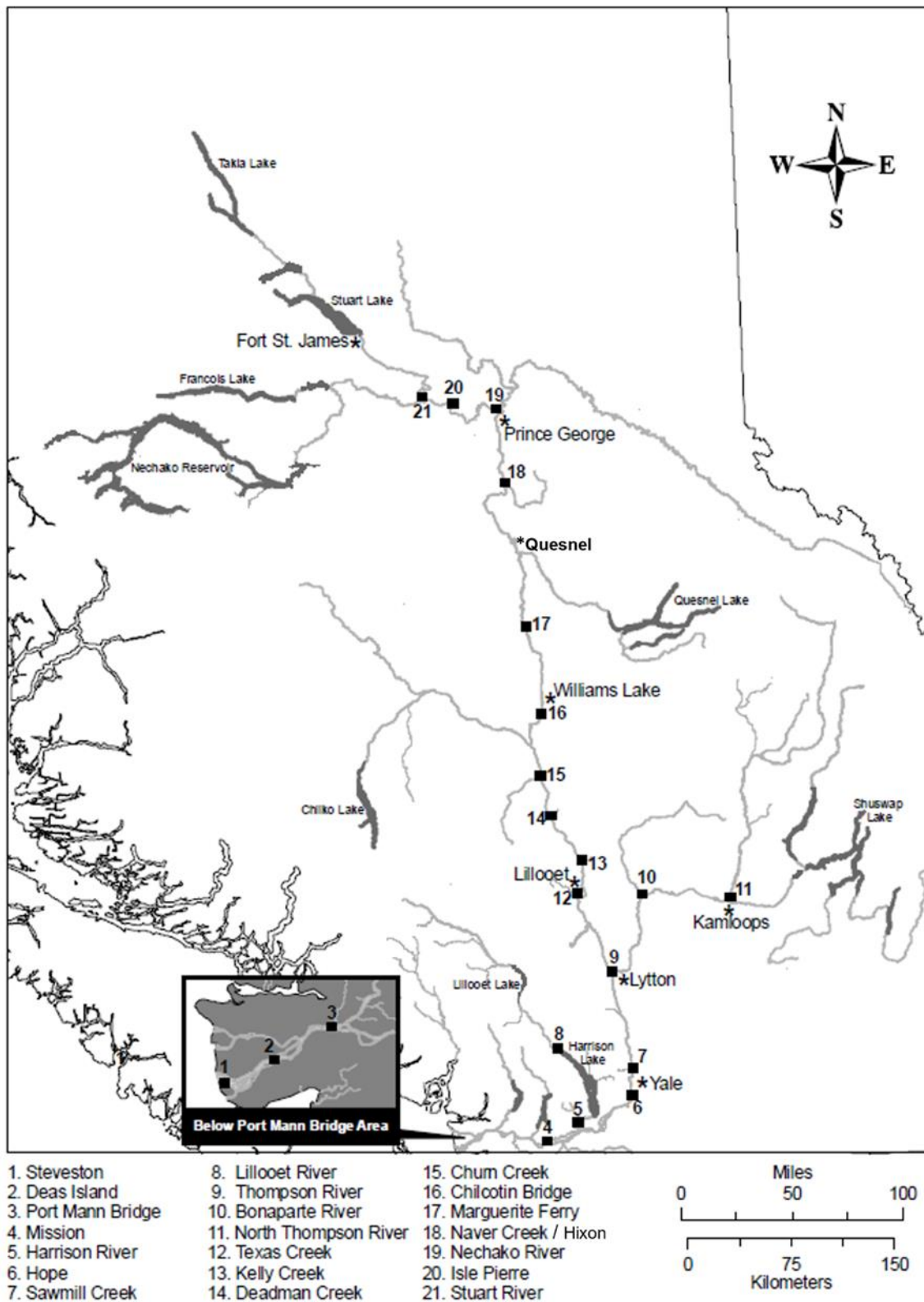
¹ Gear restrictions remain in place to protect Sakinaw Sockeye until July 25 (Queen Charlotte and Johnstone Straits - Areas 11 to 13) and August 15 (northern Strait of Georgia - Areas 14 to 16) unless the early-timed window extends beyond those dates.

² Additional sockeye closures will remain in place in portions of Areas 11 and 12 until late July in waters north of Lewis Point to protect Nimpkish Sockeye.

³ Management actions described here are just for Fraser River Sockeye-directed fisheries. Any fisheries directed on other stocks or species in the areas and times described may also have measures to limit impacts on Fraser-bound Sockeye (e.g., gear restrictions in licence conditions).
