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ENBRIDGE CONTRACTOR SAFETY AND ENVIRONMENTAL ORIENTATION – An annual training for those who wish to participate in work around Enbridge facilities. Covering Enbridge's commitment to safety and environmental protection.

Enbridge Ground Disturbance – Enbridge specific ground disturbance training concentrating on safety, and safe work practices.

Enbridge Spotter Training – Enbridge specific spotter training. Spotter training discusses the **safe backing and movement of equipment on construction sites**.

Wildlife Awareness and Bear Spray Training – Presented by WildSafeBC, this comprehensive course is designed for anyone working in wildlife country, group leaders or anyone that wants to receive in depth knowledge about wildlife species we come into conflict within BC. Bear spray is only safe and effective if you become knowledgeable on how and when to use it, how to transport it safely, and have practiced removing it from the holster and discharging it. A bear or other wildlife encounter can happen quickly; this training provides participants with the knowledge to safely use bear spray.

First Aid Level 2 - Intermediate First Aid (formerly OFA Level 2) in BC is a 2-day (16-hour) course designed for designated workplace first aid attendants at moderate-to-high-risk worksites. It meets WorkSafeBC requirements and covers advanced patient assessment, airway management, and trauma response, including CPR.

Ground Disturbance 201 (GDII) – This BCCGA endorsed Ground Disturbance for Supervisors Standard 201 course is designed for supervisors and anyone who needs a strong understanding of ground disturbance procedures. It provides an in-depth understanding of ground disturbance legislation, safe work procedures, and the damage prevention process.

Transport of Dangerous Goods (TDG) – This course covers handling, shipping, carrying, or receiving dangerous goods in Canada. Learners will understand how to confidently manage dangerous goods, handle shipping documentation, recognize hazards, and understand what to do during an emergency response.

Workplace Hazardous Materials Information System (WHMIS) – This course teaches workers how to identify and safely handle hazardous chemicals in the workplace. It covers hazard classifications, WHMIS labels and pictograms, and how to interpret Safety Data Sheets (SDS) to understand chemical risks and safe handling procedures. The course also explains proper selection and use of personal protective equipment (PPE) and outlines emergency response procedures for spills, exposures, and other hazardous incidents.

Pipeline Construction Safety Training (PCST) – For anyone working in the oil and gas pipeline construction industry. This course is designed to familiarize workers with the unique safety requirements associated with working in the pipeline construction industry, from construction to inspection.
