EVACUATION

SIMPLE STEPS TO PREPARE YOURSELF



EVACUATION ALERT

Informs the public of a potential or impending threat. This allows people time to prepare to leave the affected area if needed. It also identifies the hazard area, evacuation routes, and reception centres.

EVACUATION ORDER

Informs the public of a danger to life and/or property making it unsafe to stay in the area. When an evacuation order is announced, all people in the affected area **MUST** leave. While the order is in effect, access will be controlled and security measures will be in place. All evacuees are strongly encouraged to check in at the designated reception centre so responders can confirm their safety.



EVACUATION RESCIND

When the threat is under control and the evacuated area is declared safe, an evacuation rescind will be issued. In some cases the area may remain on evacuation alert until there is no risk that the event will re-occur.

GET PREPARED

MAKE A PLAN FOR YOUR FAMILY AND PETS

Pack for your Pets

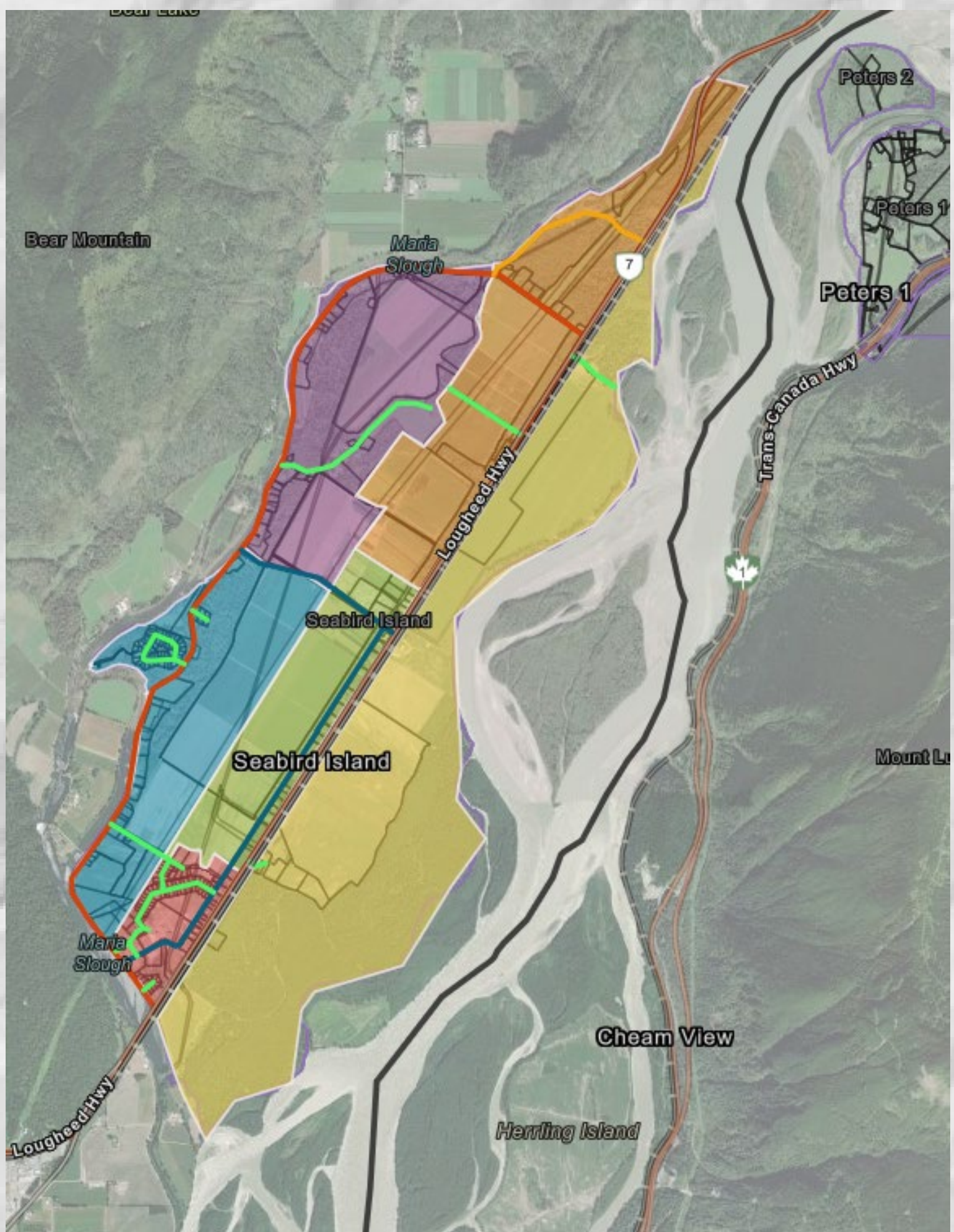


- **Leash, pet restraint, muzzle or harness**
- **Pet carrier**
- **Pet food for three days to one week**
- **Water for three days to one-week**
- **Collapsible food and water dishes**
- **Treats, a favourite toy and a small towel with your scent on it**
- **Waterproof backpack or bag for your pet supplies**
- **Copy of vaccination records**
- **Medications and basic pet first aid supplies**
- **Photos of your pet(s) with you and alone; they can be used for identification**

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Be Prepared

- Prepare for your family during the Evacuation Alert stage.
- Move campers and trailered boats to a safe area during the Evacuation Alert stage, only if possible.
- Know the hazards that surround you so you are better prepared.
- Park your vehicles so you are ready to evacuate.
